

A BILL

IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

To amend the District of Columbia Quick Payment Act of 1984 to decrease the number of days a District agency has to make a payment to a business concern after receipt of a proper invoice where a specific date has not established by contract and to decrease the number of days that a District agency has to notify a business concern in writing of any defect in the business concern's invoice or delivered goods, property, or services, or impropriety that would affect the statutorily required payment date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this act may be cited as the "Quick Payment Amendment Act of 2017".

Sec. 2. Section 3(a)(2) of the District of Columbia Quick Payment Act of 1984, effective March 15, 1985 (D.C. Law 5-164, D.C. Code § 2-221.02(a)(2)), is amended as follows:

(a) Subparagraph (A)(ii) is amended "by" striking the number "30" and inserting the number "15" in its place.

(b) Subparagraph (D) is amended by striking the number "15" and inserting the number "10" in its place.

Sec. 3. Fiscal impact statement.

The Council adopts the fiscal impact statement in the committee report as the fiscal impact statement required by section 4a of the General Legislative Procedures Act of 1975, approved October 16, 2006 (120 Stat. 2038; D.C. Official Code § 1-301.47a).
